
















WORLD LIVER DAY













































ROBOTICS





























WORKSHOP ON CODE OF CONDUCT

On April 30th Radiant school has conducted workshop on Code Of Conduct for students.

Workshop Aims:

The aim of the workshop was to share good-practice and learning around developing and implementing a code of conduct, particularly in a Zoom Meeting setting. The workshop, organised by the Sudent Counselor (Hanifa) and sponsored by the Indian Radiant School, was attended by All Admin, Teachers & Students from Radiant School and included presentation from student Counselor (Hanifa), discussions around the different approaches presented.

Presentations and shared learning:


The workshop began with an introduction from Ms. Shinu, Vice-Principal. After welcoming all attendees, highlighting the background to the workshop, and requesting mutual respect and dignity throughout, the student counselor presented in the panel session



• The student code of conduct aims at achieving the Emirati school principles of enhancing students' good manners and positive conduct, the student code of conduct applies to all students of general education institutions, from grade 3 to 12 and students of continuing education.

The student code of conduct aims at:

- Focusing on addressing student negative behaviour in the school community with promoting and encouraging positive conduct and limiting violations and bad behaviour.
- ☐ Promoting student and parent awareness of their obligations to keep self-control and good behaviour.
- ☐ Providing a regulatory reference to deal with student behaviour.
- ☐ Guaranteeing execution of proper mechanisms to tackle and protect from problem and behaviour violations.
- ☐ Requalifying violating students behaviourally and educationally.
- Under this code of conduct, a student's conduct at school is a subject, which reflects his scores in terms of morals and behaviour. It is like other subjects, subject to pass/fail evaluation.













Conduct total grading points are 100, and granted based on the following two principles:

□ Positive conduct: it is expected from all students to have positive behaviour without violations. A score of 80 per cent for positive conduct will be allocated automatically to each student at the beginning of every semester. In case of committing a violation, the proper procedure will be taken and penalty points will be deducted from that score according to the type of violation.

☐ Excellent conduct: it reflects great practices made by the student. A score of 20 per cent is allocated for excellent conduct.

Key recommendations:

Deduction from the conduct scores will be based on the type of violation as follows:

- ☐ First-degree (simple) violation: 4 points will be deducted
- ☐ Second-degree (fairly dangerous) violation: 8 points will be

deducted

- ☐ Third-degree (definitely dangerous) violation: 12 points will be deducted
- **☐ Fourth-degree** (severely dangerous) violation: student will be failed. In case that the student behavior mark declines to less than 60% at the end of the semester, his certificate will be withheld, and the case will be submitted to the behavior Management Committee to state the semester corrective procedures building to the learner. Closing Remarks The workshop was formerly closed by Ms. Shinu, Vice-Principal, who summarised discussions and stressed the importance of demonstrable commitment from all. A call to action was made to work on their actions plans and bring them, and any progress, to the Student Counselor meeting in 2023, to report back and share experiences.
