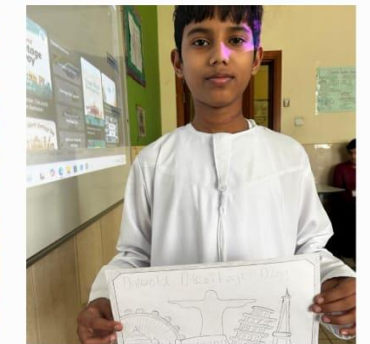
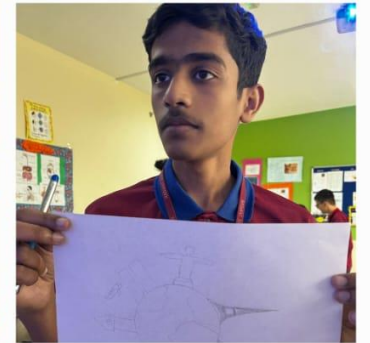
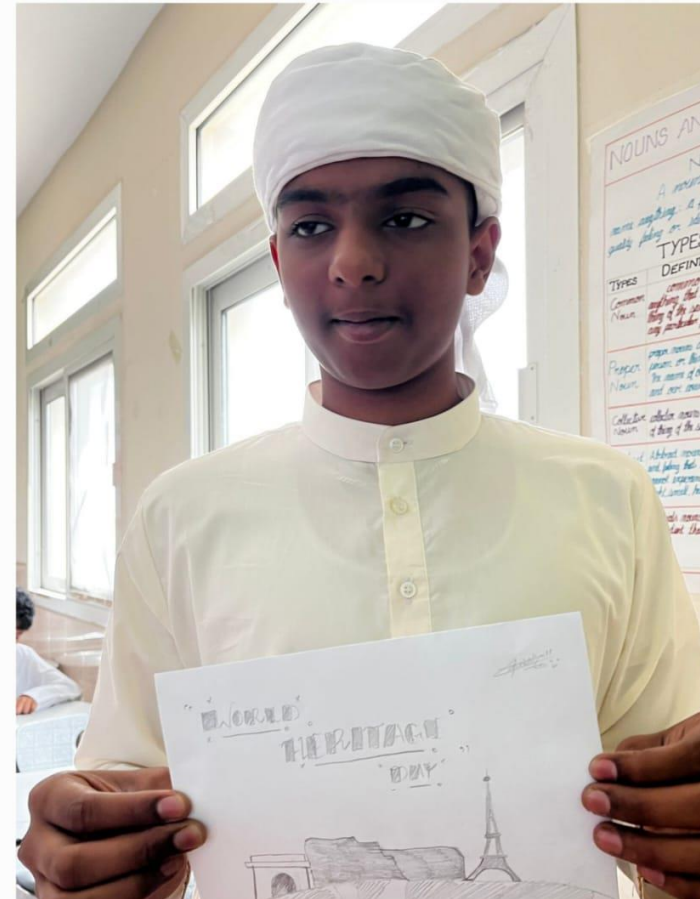




WORLD HERITAGE DAY

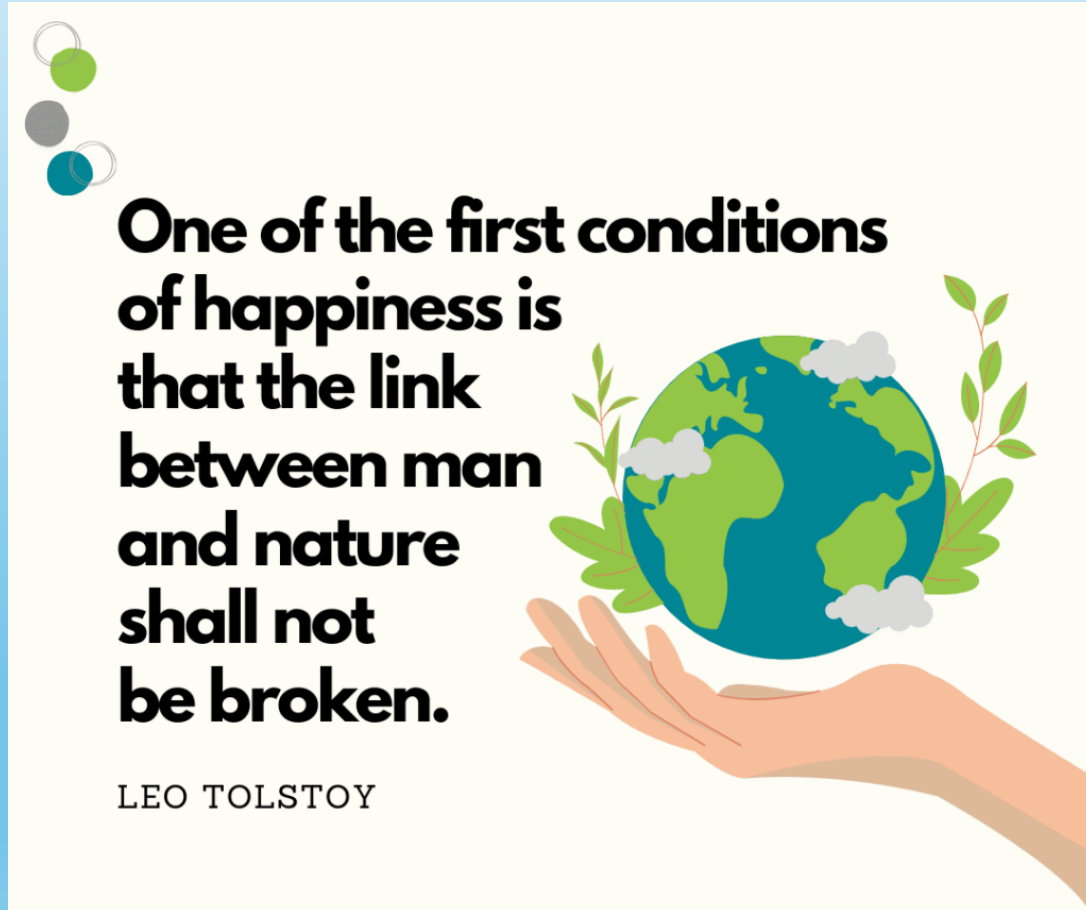

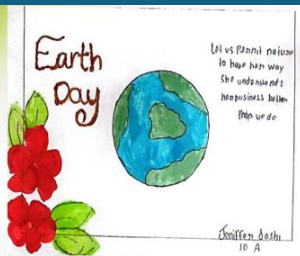
The official theme for Earth Day 2025 is “Our Power, Our Planet”

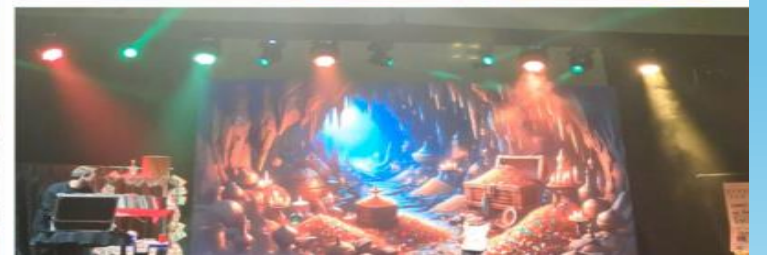


Sharjah Children's Reading Festival
